- Ensure quality of clinical care in the supported facilities
- Participate in quality assurance and improvement visits
- Ensure adherence to infection control protocols
- Prevention of new HIV and TB infections
- Build the capacity of individuals and organisations to provide optimal TB and HIV prevention and care

Reporting:

- Supervise Lay Counsellors on data capturing and reporting aspects
